


GUIDED TOUR: LIFE IN THE ST. LAWRENCE VALLEY


EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY AT THE ZOO: BREAKFAST FOR THE ANIMALS


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EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY AT THE ZOO: **ZOOKEEPER FOR A DAY**

- An up-close encounter with reptiles
- Meal preparation and creation of enrichments for several animals by the participants as zookeepers-in-training!
- A chance to feed the animals from the observation plateforms!

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PRESENTATION: THE ECOSYSTEMS OF QUEBEC

Live animals, artifacts and other visual aids will accompany the presentation.






PRESENTATION: THREATENED SPECIES OF QUEBEC: CONSERVATION PROJECTS OF THE ECOMUSEUM ZOO

We hear a lot about protecting and conserving the natural world that surrounds us, but what does that involve? Imagine yourself in the shoes of a biologist from the Ecomuseum Zoo, waist-deep in water, geared up, searching for answers to better understand and conserve our province's flora and fauna. During this presentation, you will become familiar the projects carried out by the Ecomuseum Zoo's research and conservation team and discover how you too can take action.

Live animals, artifacts and other visual aids will accompany the presentation.






PRESENTATION: MEET A WILDLIFE EXPERT!

Which animals roam the habitats across Quebec? What characteristics distinguish them, and which ones can we find even in our own backyards? This educational and interactive presentation is led by one of our zoologists who are experts on all things wildlife and is accompanied by live animals.

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WORKSHOP: OWL PELLET DISSECTION

Owls are predators and eat their prey whole... But what happens to the parts they cannot digest?

In this workshop, participants will dissect pellets collected from the Ecomuseum Zoo, reconstruct the bones they find, and ultimately reveal the diet of the owls under our care!

Format: 1 At the Zoo with guided tour

2 Our zoologists visit your classrooms

CAPACITY & PRICING*

1 At the Zoo with guided tour (1h30): Minimum of 20 and maximum of 30 students per presentation. Maximum of 4 presentations per day. Student = \$10.00 (scientific workshop) + \$8.50 (guided tour) = \$18.50 Additional* accompanying adult = \$27.00 *We offer one free accompanying adult for every 10 paying students.

Our zoologists visit your classrooms: Minimum of 25* and maximum of 30 students per presentation. Minimum of 2 and maximum of 4 presentations per trip. Élève = 7,75 \$ Fees per contract: preparation \$50.00 and transport \$0.87/km from 55km in one direction (maximum 85 km). + Waiting time totaling more than 60 minutes between presentations = \$55.00/hour. *or monetary equivalen

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
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WORKSHOP: WILDLIFE DETECTIVES: ANIMAL TRACKS

Wild animals are hard to spot in the wild, but they often leave traces behind, such as fur, footprints, sheds and moults, antlers... and droppings of course!

In this workshop, participants will learn the methods used by scientists to identify animal tracks that can be found in nature across Quebec!



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
